

Tear gas and stones as Kenya protesters say 'Ruto must go!'

REUTERS- Riot police fired tear gas and charged at stone-throwing protesters in downtown Nairobi and across Kenya in the most widespread unrest since at least two dozen protesters died in clashes a week ago.
