

Twisters first reactions land ahead of cinema release

DIGITAL SPY – Twisters lands [in cinemas next week](#), and we now have the first reactions for the sequel to the '90s classic.

Directed by Minari's Lee Isaac Chung, the standalone sequel sees [Daisy Edgar-Jones](#) and [Glen Powell](#) play rival storm chasers who find themselves on a collision course with multiple storm systems, leading to the fight of their lives.

Following its European premiere tonight (July 8) in London's Leicester Square, those lucky few to have already seen Twisters have taken to Twitter to share their first reactions.

[The Revenant](#) writer Mark L Smith wrote the script from a story idea by Joseph Kosinski, who directed [Top Gun: Maverick](#) and the upcoming [F1](#).

Ahead of its release, Twisters has been [confirmed to be longer than Twister](#), clocking in at 122 minutes, compared to the original's 108 minutes.

Despite the title, don't expect Twisters to be that connected to the original movie either.

“It’s a separate story. It’s not a continuation of the original. But it’s just a real wild ride with some good, fun characters,” Smith [explained last year](#).

“Hopefully, we can tap into what the original had because that thing is just iconic. But it’s so cool to have a director like Isaac taking on something like this. It’s just so out of his norm.”

Twisters is released in UK cinemas on July 17 and in US cinemas on July 19.
