

“Economic and social development is possible if skilled entrepreneurs are created”

Md. Sanauallah Riyad, Barguna:: “Training is needed to become skilled. And this training must definitely be put to use. If at least ten crore young people in Bangladesh can be made entrepreneurs with the right skills, then only then will it be possible to develop this country economically and socially.

Md. Ahsan Kabir, Additional Secretary of the Planning Division of the Ministry of Finance, said these things in his speech as the chief guest of the event to the youth attending the community outreach meeting of the Recovery and Advancement of Informal Sector Employment (RAISE) project implemented and organized by Sangram with the technical and financial support of Palli Karma Sahayak Foundation (PKSF).
