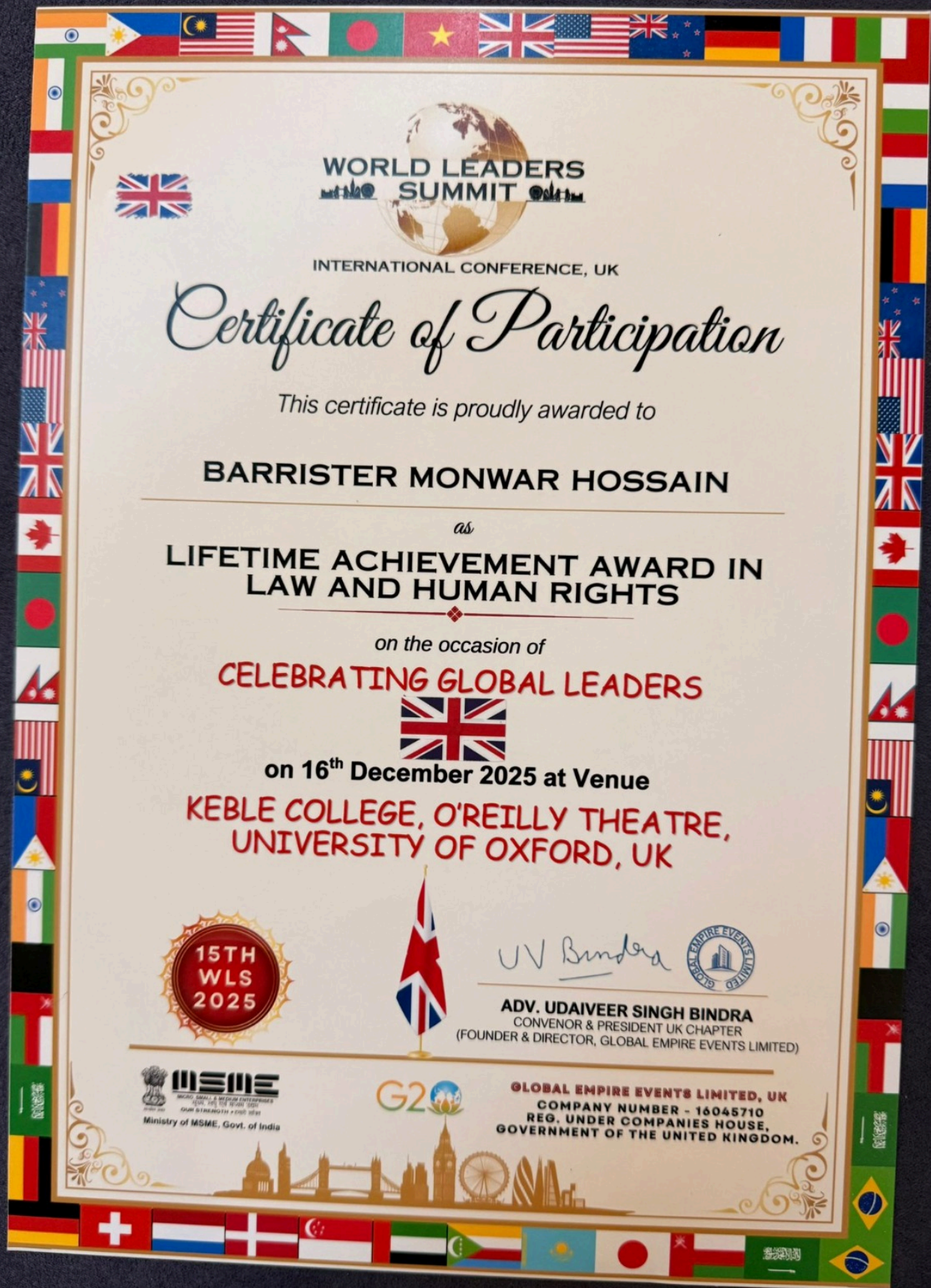


Bangladeshi son Barrister Monwar Hossain has received the Lifetime Achievement Award at an international conference in Oxford

Syed Mohammad Kamrul Islam:: Distinguished British-Bangladeshi lawyer Barrister Monwar Hossain has been awarded the prestigious Lifetime Achievement Award in Law and Human Rights at the 15th World Leaders Summit International Conference held at Keble College, University of Oxford. The award was presented to him at the conference and award ceremony held yesterday.

Representatives from various Diplomats, professionals and charitable organizations from more than 30 countries around the world participated in this international conference and award ceremony. The award – a crest, medal and certificate – was presented to Barrister Manwar Hossain by former British MP Virendra Sharma, who served for 18 years, and Ms. Ruby Grenzar, a well-known figure in Oxford's educated and student community.
